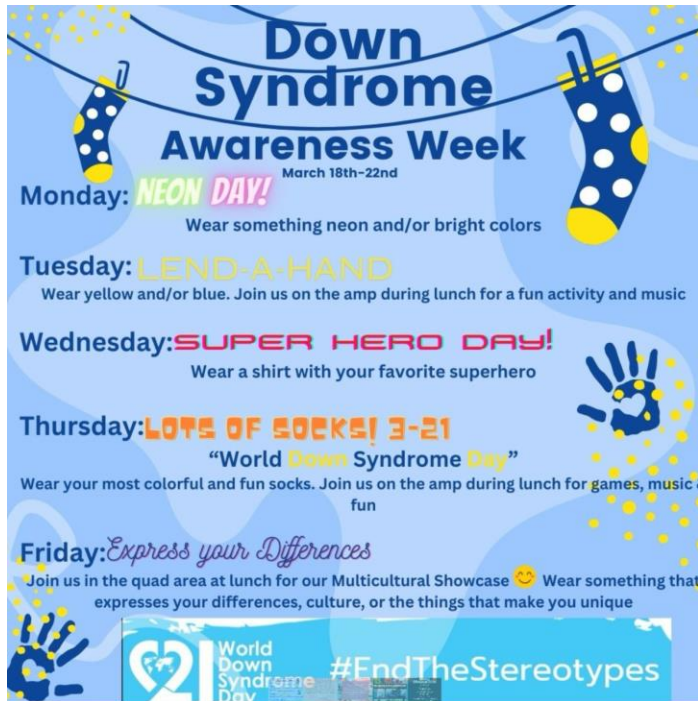

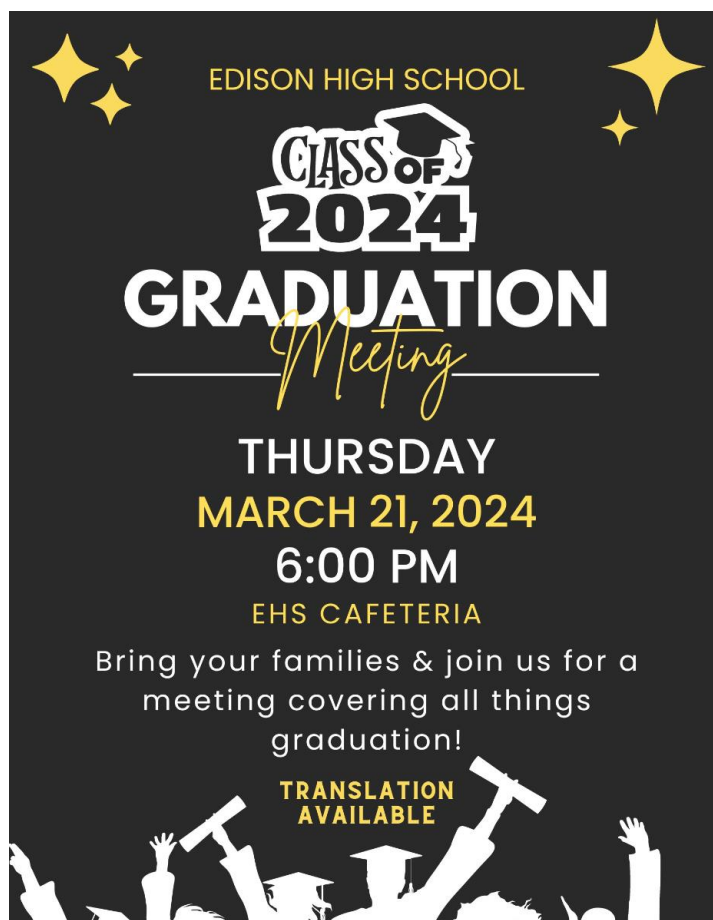
Many wonderful things happening this week before Spring Break! Please join us in celebrating Down Syndrome Awareness week with dress up days and different activities happening each day at lunch.

Student Attendance Efforts



Dear Edison Families,

This year has taken off in full swing and we are proud to announce our efforts to ensure that all students reach their greatest potential. One way of supporting this vision is by addressing the attendance concerns within our district and school.

Getting into the habit of daily attendance is more important than ever. It helps to:

- reduce stress
- make it easier to connect with friends and teachers
- support learning

Daily attendance also upholds the law. California Education Code 48260-48273, requires that "students between the ages of 6-18 attend school full-time. According to our Fresno Unified Board Policy 5113.1, the District is committed to working with students and their families to ensure that poor attendance does not adversely impact their academic success."

Education code 48260 (a) also says that "any student subject to compulsory full-time education who is absent from school without valid excuse three (3) full days in one (1) school year, or tardy or absent for more than any thirty (30)-minute period during the school day without a valid excuse on three (3) occasions in one (1) school year, or any combination thereof, is a truant and shall be reported to the attendance supervisor or to the Superintendent of the school district."

At this point in the school year, if your child is below 90% in their daily attendance rate; we will ask you to provide a doctor's note to clear your child's absences when they have medical appointments. If your child is below 90% and does not have a doctor's note to clear their medically related absence, our office will be coding the absence as a Parent Request. The code of Parent Request is not a fully excused absence and is considered a truancy.

We want to support you and your student in any way that we can. If your child is in need of attendance support, please call our front office at 559-457-2650.

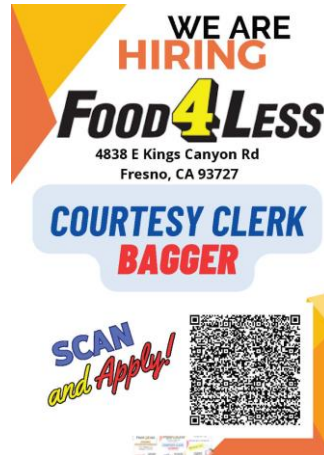
