Edison High School has led student achievement in Fresno Unified. In 2023, Edison increased SBAC standardized test scores resulting in 68% in ELA & 32% in Math respectively, leading FUSD compared to other high schools. Among our notable graduates in music is Lolly Vegas from the band Redbone and accomplished underground rapper Planet Asia. Edison's Summer Bridge & Link Crew are high school transition programs that welcome incoming freshmen and help them feel comfortable throughout the first year of their high school experience. Having a positive experience in their first year in high school has proven to increase a student's chance for academic success.

Student Success

We pride ourselves on the performance of our students. Three main areas that will be continuously monitored and reviewed for all students will be academic performance, attendance, and behavior. If students are on a transfer, they can have their file reviewed at any time to ensure they are meeting the academic performance, attendance, and behavior criteria to continue at Edison. We recommend that families to be active participants in the achievement of the students. Students are expected to use resources available to them at school and online. Tardy Policy

To help prepare college and career ready graduates, Edison High School enforces an on-time policy. Students are expected to be in their class and prepared to learn prior to the sound of the tardy bell in every class and every day. Random Tardy Sweeps will be conducted campus wide. Students who are tardy or out of class without a pass will have consequences assigned and parents will be contacted. Follow-up actions may include detention, loss of school privileges, Saturday School, and SARB processes.

Technology

Afterschool Program

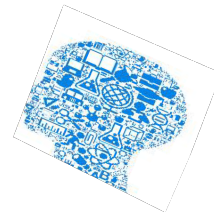

Dress Code



Appropriate attire and appearance are necessary to be prepared for college and careers. As such, Edison High School provides students with a dress code that promotes safety and a healthy learning environment free from distraction. The goal is to work collaboratively with parents to ensure our students are coming to school in dress code and prepared to learn in a safe environment. Please familiarize yourself with our current dress code. Students who do not meet the guidelines of our dress code will be sent to Administration South and given an opportunity to change the article of clothing. The article of clothing will stay there until the end of the school day and parents will be contacted for additional support. Parents will also be contacted if no options are available for the student to change their article of clothing or the student refuses the options provided, parents will be contacted to bring the student an article of clothing that meets the dress code and would allow the student to return to class. Any refusal on the part of students during this process will lead to increased parent communication and collaboration to identify the best response for the student to meet expectations.

Please encourage our students to take advantage of instructional time by adhering to the dress code.

To better support student safety, we want to emphasize the FUSD dress code policy that requires students to **always** have their **Student ID Card** with them while on campus. Students will be asked to present their ID cards multiple times throughout the school day to ensure they are in class receiving all their high-quality, standards based, instructional time. This dress code is for the 2023-2024 school year, as put forth by the Fresno Unified School District.

(FUSD Policy Below):

“Students' clothing must not present a health or safety hazard or interfere with the educational process.” ~ FUSD

The following dress code applies to all sexes and genders, and will be enforced at the school site, and all school activity locations: any apparel, hairstyle, cosmetic or jewelry, even if not specifically mentioned below, which creates a safety concern, draws undue attention to the wearer, or which tends to detract from the educational process is not acceptable.

1. Every high school student must have in their possession a valid student I.D. card.
2. Clothing, hats, beanies, Do-rags, or accessories with logos/mascots of professional sports is prohibited, (e.g., Raiders, 49ers, Oakland A's, Dodgers). Any clothing or accessories depicting bulldogs (word or image of) such as Fresno State Bulldogs and Georgetown Hoyas are not acceptable. Gang-related symbols, insignias, or “colors” are not to be worn or displayed. Any clothing item or accessory that is over 50% bright red, or bulldog red, will not be permitted. Likewise, any clothing that is over 50% royal blue, or Dodger blue, will not be permitted.
3. Clothing with lettering or drawings which depict sexually suggestive expressions or actions, profanity, obscenity, drugs, alcohol, or tobacco, or which degrade the integrity of individual groups may not be worn.
4. See-through or sexually suggestive apparel, which exposes the body or skin in a sexually suggestive manner, is not acceptable. No undergarments may be revealed. Underwear-type sleeveless shirts, spaghetti straps or any top (e.g., tube tops and halter tops) that does not completely cover the midriff and torso are not allowed.
5. Dresses, skirts, and shorts must not be more than 4 inches above the knee.
6. Attire, which may be used as a weapon, may not be worn (e.g., steel-toed boots, chains, items with spikes or studs).

ENFORCEMENT OF THE EDISON DRESS CODE IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF ALL STAFF.

Referrals will be made to the Vice Principals for appropriate action.



Restorative Practices

Edison High School is a restorative practices site, striving to meet the academic, social emotional, and behavioral needs of our students. Restorative practices consider the impact of behaviors on those who are harmed as well as the individual who inflicts harm. This approach is intended to improve relationships and behaviors for all students and staff, with an emphasis on the “whole child.” The premise for restorative practices is to restore relationships and effective social norms when expectations are not met for both the offender and the offended as well as any other individuals impacted by the action. It does not remove consequences, but rather, focuses on how to move forward and improve behavior in the future.

In the Classroom

Restorative practices are an expectation of Edison High School. A restorative approach in the classroom strives to demonstrate the 4 Emotional Intelligence Skills of Self-Awareness, Self-Management, Social Awareness, and Relationship Management. An example of this restorative approach would include efforts to build relationships and rapport among students, between students and teachers. Mutual respect, high expectations with high support, and a community of caring help to improve behavior in the classroom.

Class Meetings

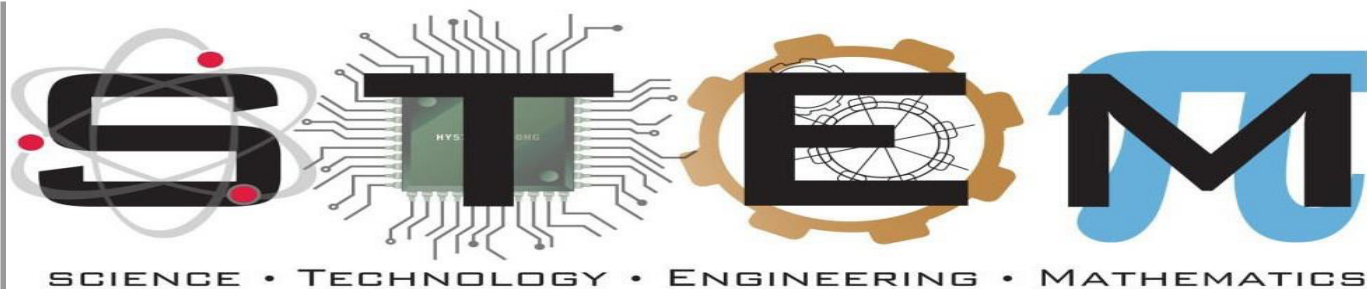
Our monthly Class (WE ACT) Meetings are designed to support restorative practices in the classroom and across the school. This time focuses on subject matter of building relationships, effective communication, cultural competencies, student interactions, participation, that are relevant, in order to prepare students for college and career. There are intended to support classroom climate, not to be isolated events.

Re-engagement Center Process

To support staff and students in building and repairing relationships, students who come to the RC will be given the opportunity to reflect on the interaction to appropriately reenter the classroom through the use of the reflection tool. When appropriate and agreed upon by all parties, students and staff members will be given the opportunity to meet in a restorative circle with the goals of restoring the relationship and making things as right as possible.

Social-emotional Support Team

Hey Tigers! Are you looking for a safe space to talk about and better understand your feelings and mental health? We have you covered. On our campus, in the South Administration building, you can find a well-rounded team of School Psychologists, Social Workers, and Counselors who are ready to support your needs. We provide supportive and intensive counseling for students, crisis support, grief support, LGBTQ+ support, counseling groups, restorative counseling, community resources for families, and much more! Edison's Academic Programs "California Gold Ribbon School"

21st century careers will require people to have critical and creative thinking skills that are linked to the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM). STEM is one of the fastest growing occupations; yet, there is a gap in qualified applicants in relation to job vacancies. If our country maintains the current state of education, there will be a shortfall of approximately 1 million STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) professionals in the near future. In order to prepare and equip Edison High School students for the growing demands in the STEM related fields, Edison is a STEM focused school that promotes four years or more of Math and Science as well as four STEM Pathways: Biomedical Science and Technology, Computer Science, Engineering Design and Development, and Green Energy and Technology Academy (GETA).

All Students—Four or More Years of Mathematics and Science

In order to expose our students to the academic rigors of post-secondary education and to qualify for Entry Level Mathematics (ELM) exemptions prior to enrollment in the CSU as well as prepare them for the growing careers in the STEM fields, students are enrolled in four years of mathematics and science at Edison High School.

STEM Pathways

The development of career-themed pathways has increased the offerings of instructional experiences that go beyond the classroom, helping students see the application of learning in the real world and exposing them to the expectations of life beyond high school. All pathways incorporate technology. Pathway courses offer students an opportunity to develop the critical thinking skills necessary for college and career readiness.

Green Energy and Technology Academy

Green Energy and Technology Academy (*GETA*) is in its 11th year of implementation. GETA is a program in partnership with California Department of Education (*California Partnership Academy*) and PG&E. This is a three-year program (*10th-12th grade*) offering rigorous classes in electronics, lab safety, and photovoltaic energy.

Our other three pathways are modeled after the nationally recognized Project Lead the Way which provides robust training and resources for teachers.

Engineering Design and Development

The Engineering pathway is in its tenth year of implementation and continues to boast very dedicated and active freshman, sophomore, junior and senior cohorts. It consists of a sequence of four engineering courses where students are exposed to Computer-Aided Design and Drafting (CADD), vex robotics, mechanical and electrical engineering.

Biomedical Science and Technology

The Biomedical Science and Technology Pathway is in its ninth year of implementation with all grades. It consists of a sequence of four biomedical courses where students are exposed to biology, medicine, anatomy and physiology, and psychology. Students enrolled in the Biomedicine pathway are likely to complete eight or more science courses before graduating.

Computer Programming and Application Development Program

In the fall of 2014, Computer Programming and Application Development Program started. The Class of 2022 will be the fifth cohort to graduate. Students take two Computer Science Advanced Placement courses, and the goal of this pathway is to help the students become creators of technology and to improve their skills for designing, logical reasoning, problem solving, and collaborating.



Advanced Placement Program



Did you know that Edison High School offers more AP courses than any other school in Fresno or Clovis? The Advanced Placement (AP) program was created by College Board (<https://www.collegeboard.org>), which offers college-level curriculum and examinations to high school students in many subject areas. The curriculum is designed to attract and challenge students who have strong reading, writing, and critical-thinking skills who are interested in challenging themselves in preparation for post-secondary education. At the conclusion of the school year, students who take and pass an AP exam with a score of 3 or higher may be able to receive college credits. Counselor Welcome

The Edison High School Counseling team is a dedicated and dynamic team of counselors that are ready to serve your child! We have 9 counselors that are assigned by alpha to your child. I serve as head counselor and oversee the services provided by the Counseling Department. Our counselors provide services in three main domains: academics, personal/ social, and career, and assist with the overall safety of the school. We are an excellent first stop to find the information you need. Your child can request to see their counselor by email, Teams Chat, or by visiting the Counseling Office in the Administration South building before school, at break, during lunch, or after school. A Counselor Appointment Request Form may also be completed in our office. Students and parents are welcome to email or call their counselor as well. You can find their contact information on the Important Numbers to Know page in this packet. Information on schedule distribution and late registration is also below. Student Schedules

Student schedules were created by our counselors and should reflect both graduation and college entrance requirements (A-G). The master schedule was developed based on the requests your child made in the spring and the courses that your child needs for graduation. If you feel there is an error in your child's schedule, your child will have the opportunity to request a change of program if:

1. There is a class missing that your child needs for graduation or CSU/UC requirements.
2. Your child passed a class during summer school.

We cannot accept requests to change to a different teacher or move a class to a different period. We may not be able to accommodate a request for an elective change due to limited space and availability. Requests for schedule changes that are not a result of the items above will require parent notification and may not be honored.

Parking, Drop-Off & Pick-up

Edison High School values the safety and security of our students, staff, and visitors. Our Administrators and Campus Safety Assistants start arriving at 7:30am. The main office opens at 7:30am and closes at 4:30pm. If you are dropping your child off, we recommend early arrival to avoid congestion and traffic. Dropping your child off by 8:00am will ensure they will be on-time to class. Keep in mind heavy traffic begins after 8:00am. For families who transport their child, we ask that you drop off and pick up in front of the school due to heavy vehicle and pedestrian traffic in the parking lot.



Student Parking Permits Required

All students who drive to school must obtain an EHS Student Parking Permit from our Financial Technician, Mr. Yang. Parking Permit Applications will be available on August 7, 2023. Students are required to complete an application and provide a copy of their CA driver's license and car registration. We will start enforcing Parking Permits on the first day of school, August 14, 2023. Parking Permits must be hung from the rearview mirror and be visible. Students will need to park in the student parking lot located in front of the gym. Students are not allowed to park in the North Parking Lot or the South Parking Lot or any other reserved places for staff and visitors. **With student safety as our primary focus, any student that does not have a parking pass will not be allowed to park on campus.**



Student Medication



Students may NOT carry medications on campus without proper approval. For medication to be administered at school, a Medication at School Form must be signed by the parent and physician and renewed each academic school year. All medications, including inhalers, prescription meds, and over-the-counter meds are to be reviewed by our School Nurse and kept in the Nurse's Office in a locked cabinet. Any emergency medication, such as glucagon, EpiPen and inhaler can be carried by student with a written order from a physician and cleared by our School Nurse. Education Code Section 49423 defines certain requirements for administration of medication, "... any pupil who is required to take, during the school day, medication prescribed for them by a physician, if the school district receives the following:

1. a written statement from such physician detailing the method, amount, and time schedules by which such medication is to be taken and
2. a written statement from the parent or guardian of the pupil indicating the desire that the school
